PRELIMINARY TITLE

ARTICLE 1º.- The General Regulations of the SPANISH BOWLING FEDERATION (hereinafter FEB) is the basic rule of development of the FEB Statutes, and regulates the statute of persons and entities subject to the jurisdiction of the FEB, the general rules that will govern the competitions that it organizes, its organic structure and its documentary regime.

FIRST TITLE

OF THE SPORTS FEDERATIONS OF THE AUTONOMOUS COMMUNITIES

FIRST SECTION - GENERAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE 2º.- The territorial organization of the FEB will be adjusted to that of the State in Autonomous Communities.

ARTICLE 3º.- The Autonomous Sports Federations (hereinafter FDAA), constituted according to current regulations, will necessarily recognize in their Statutes the competence of the FEB in those matters recognized by State regulations.

ARTICLE 4º.- The FDAA that formalize its integration in the FEB will hold its representation before the respective Autonomous Communities. The mentioned integration supposes:

- Formal compliance by the FDAA with the FEB Statutes and other applicable provisions.
- The duty to adapt its statutory rules to the FEB Statutes

ARTICLE 5º.- When in an Autonomous Community there is no FDAA, or existing, has not formalized its integration in the FEB, the latter, in coordination with the sports administration of the corresponding Autonomous Community, may establish a Territorial Unit or Delegation, respecting, in any case, the autonomous organization of the State.

ARTICLE 6º.- The FEB will be empowered to carry out follow-up and control tasks in relation to the subsidies that the FDAA receive directly or indirectly from it, under the conditions established by the Higher Sports Council or corresponding body.

SECOND SECTION - OF SPORTS COMPETITIONS

ARTICLE 7º.- The FDAA must join the FEB so that its members can participate in official sports activities or competitions at the state level.

ARTICLE 8º.- The FDAA integrated in the FEB must provide the FEB with all the necessary information to know, at all times, the programming and development of competitions and sports activities. Likewise, they will inform the FEB of the additions and deletions of its affiliates, clubs, referees, judges and coaches.

THIRD SECTION - OF THE COMPETITION

ARTICLE 9º.- The FDAA have competence for the practice and practice of bowling within the limits of their respective Autonomous Community.

ARTICLE 10º.- The FDAA, regardless of the obligations and rights conferred by the sports regulations of the State, Autonomous Communities, Statutes and other provisions of the FEB, will exercise, within their own territorial scope, the following functions: 1 - Promote, order and direct the sport of bowling within its territorial scope. 2 - Promote the creation of sports clubs, clubs or associations, and carry out the processing of the requests they receive in this regard.

3 - Federate without discrimination of race, sex, religion, ideology or nationality those who, complying with the established regulations, intend to join the FEB

4 - Stimulate and develop the sport of bowling, organizing competitions in order to give more popular dissemination of them.

5 - Coordinate the celebration of competitions that their clubs, supporters clubs and associations request to organize, doing it in such a way that sports interests are not harmed. 6 - Favor the initiatives proposed by the FEB

7 - Address the payment obligations that as a debtor have with the FEB

8 - Maintain discipline in all sectors of your organization, complying with and enforcing all the highest-ranking norms and provisions emanating from the Bodies to which they are subordinate.

ARTICLE 11º.- The Federations attached to the FEB must promote the training of:

- Referees, and where appropriate, coaches, adjusting as regards the former, to the FEB regulations
- Players, developing initiation, specialization and follow-up courses that allow them to improve their technical conditions.

SECTION FOUR - SPECIFIC OBLIGATIONS

ARTICLE 12°.- The FDAA must collect and transfer the fees of its affiliates to the FEB

ARTICLE 13°.- The FDAA will recognize in its Statutes the competence of the FEB in the official competitions organized by it, or that the FEB delegates and that exceed its territorial scope.

ARTICLE 14°.- The validity of the competitions held by the FDAA, jointly or individually with the FEB, and the results that may be derived that directly or indirectly affect changes in category in players or entities, will be conditioned on their approval by the FEB

ARTICLE 15°.- The FDAA will necessarily facilitate the FEB, on an annual basis or at the request of the FEB, the programming and development of their sports activities, as well as their execution.

SECOND TITLE

OF SPORTS ASSOCIATIONS AND BOWLING CLUBS

FIRST SECTION - PERSONALITY AND CAPACITY

ARTICLE 16°.- Bowling sports clubs, private associations made up of natural or legal persons, whose purpose is the promotion of bowling, the practice of bowling by their members, as well as participation in sports activities and competitions, will be considered.

SECOND SECTION - OF THE ADSRIPTION

ARTICLE 17°.- Every sports club to participate in official competitions, must join the FEB Said registration must be made through the FDAA when they are integrated into the FEB

ARTICLE 18°.- The recognition for sports purposes of a Club will be accredited by certification of its registration in the corresponding Register of Sports Associations.

ARTICLE 19°.- The Club will register with the FEB once it has been verified that the documentation referred to in the previous article complies with the provisions of the FEB Statutes and, consequently, the FEB will assign it a number that will appear in its Club Register.

ARTICLE 20°.- The Board of Directors of the sports clubs and associations attached to the FEB must respect the Statutes and Regulations of the FEB, as well as carry out the regulated provisions

in Law 10/90 of October 15, on Sports, and regulatory provisions relating to sports.

THIRD SECTION - OF RECORDS AND PENALTIES

ARTICLE 21°.- When a sports club or association fails to comply with the rules and agreements of the FEB bodies, it will be issued in accordance with the provisions of the Disciplinary Regulations of the FEB, without prejudice to any other rules that may be applicable.

ARTICLE 22°.- Sports clubs and associations that are on file or have outstanding obligations will not have the right to participate in any official competition.

SECTION FOUR - OF THE DENOMINATION

ARTICLE 23°.- The name of a club may not be the same or similar to that of any other already registered within the same modality.

ARTICLE 24°.- The change of name of a club must be reliably notified to the FEB, attaching the supporting documentation that the agreement has been taken in compliance with all legal requirements.

ARTICLE 25°.- In the event of having a club with several teams, you can differentiate them from each other, for which, when formalizing the registration of each team in its various categories and modalities, the name of the Club must appear first, and then the name that distinguishes to the team.

SECTION FIVE - COMMUNICATIONS

ARTICLE 26°.- All the official communications that a sports club or association must send to the FEB will be made through its respective FDAA, and may be made directly to the FEB, sending a copy of said communication to the FDAA.

ARTICLE 27°.- The participation of sports clubs and associations in friendly matches or tournaments must be communicated to their respective FDAA, which in turn will send the documentation submitted to the FEB for its knowledge.

SECTION SIX - OF THE RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

ARTICLE 28°.- The rights of the Sports Clubs and Associations are as follows: 1 - Participate in the election and representation of the collegiate higher bodies of the FEB that correspond to them by regulation and in the proportion determined.

2 - Participate with their teams in official competitions that correspond to their category, in any case adjusting to the regulatory and competition rules that the official bodies determine.

3 - Attend with other Clubs and Associations before the FEB, to obtain the execution of the competitions of national or territorial scope. 4 -

Request clarifications from the corresponding federal bodies on the interpretation of regulatory provisions issued by them, as well as submit requests that you deem necessary for the promotion and practice of Bowling Sport.

5 - Participate with other Clubs, in friendly matches, on compatible dates indicated for official competitions, always prior knowledge and authorization of the FEB 6 - Associate for the fulfillment of its purposes.

7 - Merge in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations and other legal provisions. 8 - Any other rights that the FEB establishes for them.

ARTICLE 29°.- The obligations of the Sports Clubs and Associations are as follows: 1 - Know, respect and carry out whatever rules and provisions the FEB dictates as well as any other rules that may affect them, by reason of the matter or the territory. 2 - Comply with current regulations of the FEB, FDAА and other State bodies in sports matters. 3 - Participate with their teams in official competitions that correspond to their category, in the terms determined by the corresponding game and competition regulations.

4 - As far as possible, and when availability so permits, they must make their facilities available to the FEB, or the FDAА, when required by said organizations. 5 - Contribute to the financial support of the FEB and the corresponding FDAА, paying the fees and services as appropriate.

6 - Pay the economic rights to referees and technicians, in accordance with the applicable federal regulations.

7 - Complete, attend and answer, with the utmost diligence, the communications they receive from the federal bodies, and assist them by providing them with as much information as they request.

8 - Take care of the sports training of its players, providing the necessary means for it. 9 - Provide, for the official matches in which they participate, the playing field and facilities that meet the regulatory requirements.

10 - Recognize for all purposes, the federation licenses issued by the FEB 11 - Facilitate free entry to the sports venue for the players of the opposing team, as well as the official representatives of the different sports federations.

12 - Reserve a preferential place, within the one destined for spectators, for the authorities and representatives of the FEB who attend as such to witness the development of the competitions. 13 - Comply with the current regulations of the FEB, regarding requests for licenses from its federated.

SECTION SEVEN - OF THE FACILITIES AND THEIR SERVICES

ARTICLE 30°.- As far as possible and when availability so allows, Sports Clubs and Associations must make their facilities available to the FEB and FDAA, for the holding of official competitions,

to have federated partners who practice the sport of Bowling, imparting among its players the teachings and knowledge necessary to improve their technical conditions, actively participating in official competitions, promoting their practice, and complying with and enforcing among their associates whatever legal provisions are in force. The respective Boards of Directors will be responsible for and responsible for the behavior and compliance with the foregoing.

ARTICLE 31°.- The field of play in which official competitions are held will necessarily meet the characteristics and measures determined by the FEB regulations for each modality.

Every Club or Sports Association in whose facilities official competitions are held will be responsible, through its Board of Directors, for the good order of the players and the general public, before, during and after the end of the match.

ARTICLE 32°.- Every Club or Sports Association will try to adapt its sports facilities with the following services:

- 1 - Independent wardrobe service for each of the participating teams. 2 - Indoor public address equipment.
3 - Lighting service, if necessary, for holding nightly competitions. 4 - Accommodation facilities for authorities and federative members.

5.- Allow the media access to the facilities so that they can broadcast a competition, and reserve the space necessary for them to carry out their functions, under the terms agreed by the FEB

6 - Any other necessary to hold competitions in its various categories and modalities.

SECTION EIGHT - OF THE MERGER

ARTICLE 33°.- It is a right of the Sports Clubs and Associations to merge with one or more others, provided that they belong to the same Autonomous Federation. The merger agreements adopted by the respective Assemblies will be transferred to the FEB through the corresponding FDAA, before of the beginning of the season in which it should take effect.

ARTICLE 34°.- The resulting Sports Club or Association may keep its teams in the categories to which both were entitled before the merger, without prejudice to any incompatibilities they may incur, and must maintain, for at least 3 years, the registered office and domicile of the game. of the highest category.

ARTICLE 35°.- The resulting Sports Club or Association may adopt the name of one of the merged, or a new one.

ARTICLE 36°.- The resulting Sports Club or Association will request the FEB to update the federation licenses, in the time and manner determined by the FEB regulations for them. The economic cost of the licenses will be paid by the applicants, even if the previous ones had not lost their validity.

ARTICLE 37°.- The FEB will not recognize the Sports Club or Association resulting from the merger, if the economic rights that the FEB had as a creditor with those who merge had not been previously secured or satisfied.

ARTICLE 38°.- Notwithstanding the provisions of the previous article, the FEB will recognize the Sports Club or Association that results from the merger, when they ensure compliance with the economic obligations contracted.

THIRD TITLE OF

PLAYERS

FIRST SECTION - GENERAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE 39°.- The natural person who practices Bowling Sport and has the corresponding federative, individual or individual-Club license is a player, being consequently assigned to the FEB and subject to its regulations.

SECOND SECTION - PLAYER STATUS

ARTICLE 40°.- In order for a player to participate in official competitions, he must formalize the federative license, abiding by the FEB regulations.

ARTICLE 41°.- All the natural persons of Spanish nationality and foreigners from the community or not, who prove their nationality in the case of the community, or the possession of the valid residence permit for non-community members can obtain the federative license. Those persons who are disqualified as a result of the offenses provided for in articles 14 and 15 of the Organic Law on Health Protection and the Fight against Doping in Sport may not obtain an approved federal or autonomous regional license.

THIRD SECTION - OF THE CATEGORIES

ARTICLE 42°.- Players will be classified according to the following criteria: 1 - SEX

- 1.1 - MALE
- 1.2 - FEMALE

2 - AGE

- 2.1 - BENJAMINES: 9-10 years old within the year the season begins
- 2.2 - ALEVINES: 11-12 years old within the year the season begins
- 2.3 - CHILDREN: 13-14 years old within the year the season begins
- 2.4 - CADETS: 15-16 years old within the year the season begins
- 2.5 - YOUTH: 17-18 years old within the year the season begins (compatible with those of quality of play).
- 2.6 - VETERANS: from the age of 60 within the year in which the season begins, this category is elective and not compatible with those of quality of play, and taking into account in any case, the modifications that may be necessary due to the peculiarities of each sport modality.

3 - QUALITY

The quality categories will be those determined in each case by the respective Regulations and Regulations of each of the modalities (1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc.)

SECTION FOUR - OF THE HIGHS AND LOWS OF PLAYERS

ARTICLE 43°.- A player may withdraw from his Club, at any time, even if his license has not expired, requiring the submission to the FEB, by the Club in which he withdraws, of a letter accepting such an end.

ARTICLE 44°.- Said player may sign a license with another Club of a higher, lower or equal category, as long as he has not participated in official competition with the club of origin. In the event that you have participated in any official competition with your Club, you can only sign a license with another higher category Club.

However, and due to the differences between the gaming systems of the different specialties attached to the FEB, what is stated in this article may be modified taking into account the peculiarities of each one, through its specific regulations.

SECTION FIVE - RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

ARTICLE 45°.- The player has the following rights:

1 - Freedom to subscribe license, according to the provisions of these Regulations. 2 - Participate as voters and eligible in the superior governing bodies of the FEB that are determined by regulation.

3 - Receive per diem for lodging and maintenance, and on the occasion of displacement, on behalf of the Club, Peña or Association to which it belongs, or in its case, of the Federation that would have selected it, if so determined by who corresponds .

4 - Receive free health care as a consequence of illnesses or injuries contracted directly or indirectly during the practice of Bowling Sport, through the Mutuallidad General Deportiva, or body with which the FEB or its Autonomous Federation has contracted the healthcare services, and provided that this practice complies with the rules established for it by the FEB

5 - Attend and participate in whatever tests, courses, preparation phases, selections or other types of concentrations are convened by the Federations to which they must be assigned and dependency, 6 - Any others determined by the FEB

ARTICLE 46°.- The player has the following obligations:

1 - Abide by the discipline and how many regulations the FEB, FDAA that corresponds, as well as the Club, Peña or Association in which it is registered dictate.

2 - Abide by the regulations of the FEB regarding their participation in official and friendly confrontations. 3 - Practice the sport of Bowling with sportsmanship and correction in the manner determined by the Rules of Matches and Competitions of the modality in question.

4 - Attend the training and matches of the official competitions for which it is called by the FEB, or corresponding Federation, excusing its non-attendance if the circumstances allow it, by writing addressed to the calling bodies, seven days before the holding the competition or official training.

5 - Do not intervene in any type of sports competition with equipment other than yours without prior authorization.

6 - It is the obligation of federated athletes to attend the calls of the National Team for participation in competitions of an international nature, or for the preparation of them, if a justified cause at the discretion of the FEB does not prevent it.

FOURTH TITLE OF FEDERATIVE

LICENSES

FIRST SECTION - GENERAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE 47°.- The federal license constitutes the only proof of identification of the person as a bowler registered in the FEB

ARTICLE 48°.- The federative license is personal and non-transferable. Its custody and conservation correspond to the owner of the same.

ARTICLE 48°.- The FEB, through its Board of Directors, is responsible for the management, organization and development of everything related to the issuance, preparation and control of the federal license.

ARTICLE 49°.- To participate in official sports competitions or activities at the state level, you must be in possession of a valid license issued by the FEB, in accordance with the following minimum conditions:

1 - The licenses will have uniform prices for all sports modalities, the amount of which will be set by the General Assembly, according to each class and category. 2 - The content of the licenses will also be uniform for the different categories.

3 - The FEB will issue the licenses within 15 days from the day following the request, once the compliance with the requirements established in the applicable Statutes and Regulations has been verified.

The format and dimensions of the license must be homogeneous for the entire Spanish territory.

ARTICLE 50°.- The licenses issued by the FDAA will qualify for the participation described in the previous article, provided that these federations are integrated into the FEB and also meet the following conditions:

1 - They are issued within the conditions set by the FEB 2 - Immediate written communication to the FEB of their issue.

For these purposes, the authorization will take place once the FDAA pays the FEB the corresponding financial fee.

The licenses issued by the FDAA, which in accordance with the provisions of this article enable for participation in official activities or competitions, shall record the corresponding data, at least, in the official Spanish language of the State.

SECOND SECTION - OF THE CATEGORIES AND TYPES OF LICENSES

ARTICLE 51°.- Two types of national license will be issued: 1 - INDIVIDUAL LICENSE :

for individual player as a natural person.

1.1 - SCOPE OF PLAY: The holder of the individual license obtains the right to participate in individual competitions within his own Autonomous Community, as well as in those of a national nature that are held in another Autonomous Community.

1.2 - SCOPE OF REPRESENTATION: The holder of the individual license represents in any competition himself as a natural person and the Autonomous Community to which he belongs. 2 - INDIVIDUAL LICENSE - CLUB : For individual player attached to the Club. Therefore, this class of license contains both the individual player and the natural person as well as the Club to which it has been assigned, the price of this license being the same as for the individual license, given that it is marked by the category of game.

2.1 - SCOPE OF PLAY: The holder of the individual-Club license obtains, in addition to the rights granted by the individual license (participation in individual official competitions), the right to participate in competitions involving the Club to which he belongs.

2.2 - SCOPE OF REPRESENTATION: The holder of the individual-Club license, in addition to the representation granted by the individual license, will represent the Club where it has been assigned to those competitions in which it participates.

THIRD SECTION - OF THE APPLICATION

ARTICLE 52°.- The request for a federative license will be made within the working dates established by the FEB Board of Directors, through the corresponding FDAA, or directly to the FEB if there is no autonomous federative structure, on the petition sheets issued for this purpose by the FEB, as follows: 1 - **CLUB OR INDIVIDUAL PLAYER** :

1.1 - The Club or individual player will request from their FDA the request sheets necessary to request their license.

1.2 - You will fill in the corresponding section with the data that you are interested in.

1.3 - Deliver to the FDAA the duly completed request sheets, with the signature of the owner, if the request is for an individual player, and the signature of the Club manager and its seal, if the request is for a Club, paying in both cases, the fees established for this purpose, receiving at the time of payment the amount thereof, a copy of the aforementioned request form completed by the FDAA in the records section. 2 - **FDAA** :

The FDAA, once it has in its possession the request sheets for the licenses of the players or requesting Club, and without delay, will send them to the FEB for processing, who in view of the same, will send the corresponding charges, to the In order for said FDAA to make the amounts effective, meanwhile, the licenses issued remain on deposit at the FEB

ARTICLE 53°.- In relation to the request for a federal license, the following situations will be considered:

1 - Player who develops his sports activity both individually and as a club, within the FDAA that corresponds to his domicile.

In this case, either the individual player or the Club requesting the federative license will follow the procedure detailed in the previous article.

Once said request has been made, the license will be issued outlining the data related to the Federation and Club, as detailed:

2 - The player who develops his sport activity in the individual aspect, within the FDAA that corresponds to him by his domicile and is attached to a Club of different FDAA. In this case, it will act as follows:

2.1 - It will be the individual player who requests the license in a single request form, in the FDAA that corresponds to him by his address, stating in the heading the data of the FDAA Club for which he wants to join, or

2.2 - The Club to which you wish to join will be the one that requests the license from the FEB, stating in the corresponding section, the Federation to which the player belongs.

Once said request has been made, the license will be issued outlining the data related to the Federation and Club, as detailed:

3 - Player who develops his sport activity in a Club of the FDAA that corresponds to him by his domicile and causes low during the season in that Club and high in another of the same or different FDAA. In this case, the player who withdraws must process a new license application by the procedure referred to in the previous article, adjusting to the provisions of points 1 and 2 as appropriate in each case.

For the specific case of the Bowling modality, and taking into account that the season covers periods of 2 years, the players of said modality who, being attached to a Club, at the beginning of the following season, wish to register in a different one, must send the FEB a letter from the Club causing the withdrawal and another from the new Club of membership.

In the latter case, the licenses will continue to be valid until December 31 of the corresponding year, without the need to be modified, and they must be requested again from that date, by the corresponding procedure.

The same shall apply to those licenses of players affected by change of category.

FOURTH SECTION - THE DATA TO BE RECORDED

ARTICLE 54º.- The following information regarding the player will be recorded in the federative license:

FEB LOGO ARTICLE 55°.- In official competitions, players may be required to have their ID to verify their identity.

SECTION FIVE - FEES

ARTICLE 56°.- The federative license fees corresponding to the FEB will be established by agreement of the General Assembly, the economic amount of which will be the same for each specialty and category.

ARTICLE 57°.- Players, referees, clubs and FDAA bowling applicants for the federal license are subject to the payment obligation of the concepts indicated in the previous article.

ARTICLE 58°.- The contributions for the concepts of FEB and MGD Fee or Mandatory Insurance, will be directly entered into the FEB through the corresponding FDAA, this being an essential requirement for the sending of federative licenses.

SECTION SIX - OF THE OBLIGATIONS AND OF THE INTERRUPTION OF RIGHTS

ARTICLE 59°.- The federative license will be valid from the date of issue until December 31 of the same year. However, the rights that it confers may remain:

1 - INTERRUPTED 2 - MODIFIED 1 - INTERRUPTED : License whose holder is in disciplinary sanction, in which case, during the duration of said sanction, he will be deprived of the rights granted by it. **2 - MODIFIED** : License whose holder is framed in a specialty and category subject to regulations of Ascent and Descent, in which case and from the date of consolidation of the new category, both if it is for Ascent or Descent, it will cause loss in the category that It held and high in the new category acquired.

At the end of the period of validity of the license, every player will be absolutely free to sign a license with any other club, except in the Bowling modality due to its peculiar characteristic of covering its season for periods of 2 consecutive years. In this case, the provisions of the specific regulations of the modality will be followed.

The federative licenses that are issued or renew to players who are recognized as "HONORIFIED", will have permanent validity without the need for renewal, being able to take advantage of the benefits established for this purpose by the FEB

ARTICLE 60°.- The loss of the federative license and its destruction, uselessness or deterioration will carry with it for the holder the obligation to request a new one, following the procedure established previously for his request.

ARTICLE 61°.- All those players who are dedicated to the practice and game of Bowling in their various specialties within the territory of the Spanish State, and participate in official, national and international competitions, will be obliged to obtain the federative license.

ARTICLE 62°.- All persons obliged to obtain the federative license of the FEB are also required to carry it permanently with them and display it when they are required to do so by reason of location or the competition in which they participate.

SECTION SEVEN - RECORDS AND SANCTIONS

ARTICLE 63°.- The only legal link between player and Club is the federative license, which may be terminated, as a consequence of a sanction file promoted at the request of the corresponding Federation, for an infraction contemplated in the applicable state and federative sports legislation.

ARTICLE 64°.- If the decision of the file referred to in the previous article is favorable to the player, he may be authorized to sign a license by another Club, following the provisions of article 48 of these Regulations.

TITLE FIFTH OFFICIAL

COMPETITIONS

FIRST SECTION - GENERAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE 65°.- The official game season falls within the calendar year, beginning on January 1 and ending on December 31 of each year, the period of validity of the license.

In the specific case of the Bowling specialty, the official season begins on July 1 and ends on June 30 of the following year.

SECOND SECTION - OFFICIAL COMPETITIONS - REGISTRATION AND CLASSES

ARTICLE 66°.- For the purposes indicated in these Regulations, the following will be considered official competitions, and their homologated results: 1 - INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS , only those authorized or summoned by FEB in which Spanish players participate. 2 - NATIONAL COMPETITIONS , in any of its specialties and categories, that are convened by the FEB 3 - AUTONOMIC COMPETITIONS , in any of its categories, which are a preliminary qualifying phase for the competitions referred to in the previous sections, and organized by the corresponding FDAA.

4 - Any other competitions of any category and scope in which the FEB expressly confers the status of official and approved competition.

ARTICLE 67°.- Players, Clubs, Supporters Clubs or Associations must register for official competitions in the manner and within the deadline determined by the organizer. Those who are subject to a disciplinary file that so determines, or serving a sanction, may not register.

ARTICLE 68°.- The minimum annual competitions that must be held in the sport of bowling, taking into account its various specialties, will be the following: 1 - OF THE CLUBS, PEÑAS OR ASSOCIATIONS ASSOCIATED WITH A FEDERATION

A - Club, Peña or Association social championships B - Interclub,
Peñas and Associations Championships

2 - OF THE AUTONOMOUS SPORTS FEDERATIONS

A - Territorial League

B - Territorial Championships

C - Inter-territorial Championships that will never have the category of Spanish Championships. **3 - OF THE**

SPANISH BOWLING FEDERATION

A - Cup of His Majesty The King and Queen, in those modalities that have been awarded. B - National League, in those modalities in which it exists. C - Spanish Championships of the different categories. D - FEB Cup E - Spanish Cup.

F - National Circuit, in those specialties in which it exists. G - International Championships. H - Other national championships and tournaments.

ARTICLE 69°.- In the League competition, the Clubs, when registering for the competition, may suggest the time when the matches that correspond to them will take place on their field of play, which will be within the limits indicated by the corresponding competition bases. Said time may be varied in the form, term and conditions established by the FEB. In any case, it will be the FEB itself who decides the schedule of the meetings or changes thereto.

THIRD SECTION - OF THE CELEBRATION OF COMPETITIONS

ARTICLE 70°.- Requests for the holding of national competitions for each of the bowling specialties will be made at the headquarters of the FEB by means of a text letter addressed to the FEB, within the terms determined by it.

ARTICLE 71°.- Competitions may be held: 1 - Through the Cup system: Eliminations

to one or more matches. 2 - Through the League system: All against all to one or

more matches. 3 - By elimination system: (..... 24-16-8-4-2) - Phases.

4 - By any other system established by the different specialties. In this case, preference will be given to inveterate custom.

ARTICLE 72°.- When a competition is played by the League system, unless the specific regulations indicate otherwise, each match will give rise to the following scores:

A) 2 points to the winning team.

B) 1 point for each of the teams in the event of a tie, provided that the game system or the competition in question does not allow or does not provide for the tie to be broken.

C) 0 Points for the losing team.

ARTICLE 73°.- The matches or competitions may only be suspended by the FEB, who will study the circumstances of the case, and decide the date on which it must be held again. In the event of force majeure or other unforeseeable circumstances, the arbitrator shall hold this power by delegation from the FEB, to which he shall immediately inform of the causes that would have caused the suspension, and of the measures adopted.

ARTICLE 74°.- In the cases referred to in the previous article, the FEB Competition and Discipline Committee will decide whether to continue the match, indicating in this case, the day, the time and the field of play, or if it deems it finished, determine under what conditions, without prejudice to the sanctions that may be applicable.

ARTICLE 75°.- The lack of public force may motivate, in very exceptional cases, the suspension of the match, if the referee considers under his responsibility that there are no guarantees for its normal development. Faced with this circumstance, the FEB Competition and Discipline Committee will agree to the resumption of the match under the conditions and manner in which it is to be held, as well as any compensation that may arise.

ARTICLE 76°.- The rules of the game approved by the FEB will apply in all matches

ARTICLE 77°.- In all official competitions and at the end of the same, an Act will be drawn up by the Referee, which will reflect the results and incidents, if any, which will be transferred to the FEB

In the event that there is no referee, the organizing body - the club will be responsible for sending said minutes to the FEB.

ARTICLE 78°.- The elements necessary for the practice of the sport of Bowling, as well as the land where it is practiced, must meet the characteristics approved by the FEB

ARTICLE 79°.- All meetings and competitions will be held on the date and time established by the FEB. The modification of the date and time may only be agreed by the Competition and Discipline Committee, attending to situations of extreme need, and without prejudice to the rest of the competition, or by the FEB Delegate Commission to whom the FEB Statutes attribute the power to modify National Calendars.

In the League competition, and if both Clubs agree on a change of date or time, they must submit the request for change to the FEB, who in any case, will be the one who will expressly authorize the mentioned change, as long as no harm occurs to third parties.

ARTICLE 80°.- All matches or competitions will be considered to have been held on the date that appears in the official Calendar, even when they are played on another. Consequently, for the purposes of license validity, and other regulatory requirements, the situation will be as of the date indicated in the Calendar. It is excepted from the provisions of this article, which refers to compliance with sanctions.

ARTICLE 81°.- The Judge-Referee shall ensure that any meeting that is officially scheduled takes place, suspending it only in the event of force majeure, a seriously dangerous attitude by the public, or

of any of the contending teams, for the safety of the Judge-Referee or the players, or for serious technical deficiency in the installation.

ARTICLE 82°.- The playing fields to be used by the Clubs for their official matches, as well as bowling and other game elements, must meet the technical conditions indicated in the different Game Regulations.

ARTICLE 83°.- The regulatory condition of the playing fields will be determined by the FEB through the person competent in technical matters.

ARTICLE 84°.- For the celebration of a match, the visiting team has the obligation to travel in the most suitable means of transport to get to dispute the match at the appointed time, preventing the possibilities of delay. Failure to carry out this provision with sufficient diligence, may cancel the exemption of force majeure in the absence.

SECTION FOUR - THE OFFICIAL CALENDAR OF COMPETITIONS

ARTICLE 85°.- The FEB, in view of the requests for Competitions of each one of the specialties attached to it, will prepare a draft Calendar that will be submitted to the approval of the General Assembly of the FEB each year, which may delegate to the Board Direct the elaboration of the Calendars that it deems appropriate.

In any case, any national calendar must be made public at least one (1) month before the first of the competitions established by it.

ARTICLE 86°.- The Delegated Commission of the General Assembly of the FEB is empowered to modify the national calendars, when they are carried out, results would be detrimental to sports interests.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, it may delegate the aforementioned modifications to the FEB Board of Directors.

ARTICLE 87°.- To authorize change of date, time or field of play in any meeting, the Club concerned must request it prior to the dispute of the previous day indicated in the calendar. Said request should be addressed to the other contending Club and to the FEB, who could authorize said change if there were an agreement between both Clubs, and did not cause harm to third parties.

ARTICLE 88°.- If the interested Clubs express their agreement on the change of date, time or playing field, the FEB may authorize said change, provided that no alterations or damages are derived for third parties.

ARTICLE 89°.- The League matches that must be played in the first round must be completed in full before the start of the second round.

ARTICLE 90°.- The last three matches of a competition by the league system will be held in full, on the same date and time, unless specific regulations determine otherwise.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the FEB may provide variations in date, time or playing field that are necessary for special circumstances that advise it.

ARTICLE 91°.- The FEB will publish the Calendar of meetings for each competition, indicating playing fields and schedules. From the moment of the publication of the Calendar, no modification will be admitted, except those exposed in previous articles.

SECTION FIVE - PARTICIPATION IN COMPETITIONS

ARTICLE 92°.- Those who are attached to it, are aware of their obligations, both sports and administrative and economic, have the category required in the Competition Rules and specialty in question, and comply with the competitions organized by the FEB. the requirements established therein.

ARTICLE 93°.- Every player, Club, Peña or Association is obliged to participate with their teams in the official competitions that correspond to their category and for which they have previously classified. Their non-participation without express justification communicated in writing to the FEB in a reliable manner, will be considered non-appearance, and for this purpose, the sanctions established by regulation will be applied.

In competitions where prior registration is required both at the player and Club, Peña or Association, or Territorial Federation levels, and once the registration has been formalized, those of the aforementioned who wish to withdraw from the competition in which they have registered Registered, they must notify the FEB with a minimum of 7 days prior to its celebration, or with the advance notice indicated in the regulations corresponding to each specialty, except for duly justified force majeure, and thus considered by the corresponding body.

Failure to do so, or failure to appear in the competition for which you registered, will be considered non-appearance, and for this purpose, the sanctions established by regulation will be applied.

ARTICLE 94°.- A club or player is considered to have participated in a competition, if it appears in the official minutes of the competition.

ARTICLE 95°.- Player licenses do not necessarily have to be of the category of the team in which they will participate. Players with a youth license are exceptionally authorized to line up with the team. " *senior* " of the same Club.

ARTICLE 96°.- Before starting a competition, the participating players or Clubs will deposit the federation licenses at the Scorer's Table, which will be verified by the Referee-Judge before the start of the competition, and may demand this from them, if they deem it appropriate, the DNI for verification.

Failure to comply with any of the above requirements, enables the Judge-Referee to exclude the offender or offenders from the competition.

ARTICLE 97°.- In all official competition of any field, a Judge-Referee will act to ensure compliance with the Game Regulations of the modality in question, and in no case may he participate as a player and Referee.

ARTICLE 98°.- The Judge-Referee in any official competition will draw up at the end of the same the Act of its development, which will state:

- Organizing entity.
- Place, day and time of celebration.
- Modality, category, name and number of participants.
- Name of the members of the Organizing, Competition and Judge-Referee Committee.
- Results obtained by each of the participants.
- Incidents and decisions.

Said act, once completed in all its terms, will be signed by the Judge-Referee.

SECTION SIX - ON THE ORGANIZATION OF COMPETITIONS
--

ARTICLE 99°.- In all competitions, only the players or teams that appear in the Minutes, the Judge-Referee of the match, and the people who are empowered to do so may remain on the field of play.

ARTICLE 100°.- The organizers of competitions by delegation of the FEB will be responsible for the following tasks:

1 - Plan and reserve the Bowling Alley where the competition must be held, with a minimum of (2) days prior to the celebration of the same, and in which training sessions may take place, without prejudice to the holding of other official Club competitions .

2 - Provide the Facility with the appropriate conditions, as well as the necessary material for the Competition.

3 - Create a Competition Secretariat in charge of providing the interested players or clubs, with sufficient advance notice of the competition, the data related to the organization, location of the Facility, means of transportation and accommodation, training schedule, etc, as well as once it has been done, provide the duly signed Results Clubs, Peñas or Associations, the Judge-Referee, the corresponding Federation and the FEB (by sending by mail).

4 - Facilitate the media to enter the facilities so that they can carry out their functions normally, as long as it has been agreed with the FEB

5 - Require the FEB how many means, trophies, medals, diplomas and other affections to the competition to organize.

6 - Any others that by manifest omission impede the correct development of the competition.

SECTION SEVEN - INCIDENCES IN COMPETITIONS

ARTICLE 101°.- Those national competitions not included in the Calendar of the FEB, must be approved by it, upon request of the organizer, so that they can acquire the status of officers.

ARTICLE 102°.- When in a match corresponding to a tie, a team comes across an insufficient number of players, and consequently, the Referee ends the match before reaching its end, in addition to losing this match, the team that has Running out of players will also lose the tie, regardless of the outcome of the other match, so if that is the first, there will be no need to play the second, unless the specific regulations of a competition or modality determine different situations.

ARTICLE 103°.- When a team does not appear in any of the matches, or appears with an insufficient number of players, or withdraws from the field of play before the game officially ends, the other team will be classified in the tie, so if the match in which the insufficiency, non-appearance or withdrawal occurred is in the first one to be played, the second match will not be played.

ARTICLE 104°.- To ties, non-appearances or withdrawals, the provisions referring to competitions by Cup or League system will apply.

ARTICLE 105°.- When a match ends by an arbitration decision before the regulatory term as a consequence of force majeure, the Competition and Discipline Committee will determine, where appropriate, the place and time in which it can take place again.

ARTICLE 106°.- When a match ends by an arbitration decision before the statutory term, the Referee-Judge will indicate to the Competition and Discipline Committee the team guilty of the interruption. The Competition and Discipline Committee will agree, if appropriate, the resumption of the meeting, also deciding the conditions and manner in which it is to be carried out, as well as any compensation that may arise.

ARTICLE 107°.- When in a League match the Referee ends the match because one of the teams with an insufficient number of players remains, unless the Competition Committee appreciates intentionality or bad faith in said team, the final result will be as indicated by the marker At that time, if this is favorable to the entire team, or 1-0 in favor of it, if the team that was left with an insufficient number of players was winning. In this case, this point will not be deducted from this team.

However, the specific regulations of a specific competition or modality may contemplate different situations regarding scoring.

ARTICLE 108°.- In League system competitions, when when establishing the rankings at the end of the day or the competition in one of its parts or at the end, two or more teams are tied to points, to establish the definitive order will be followed. provided in the specific regulations of the modality in question.

ARTICLE 109°.- Any team that has achieved a classification in a competition that allows promotion, may renounce it in the following terms:

1 - The resignation must be made, in any case, in writing signed by the President of the Club in which the team is integrated, addressed to the corresponding Federation, and exceptionally directly to the FEB, with a copy to the FDAA, who in In the case of a Club participating in a State-wide Competition, it will inform the FEB

2 - If the resignation takes place (60) days before the start of the competition, it will be understood to be done on time, and therefore, the resigning team will retain its rights to participate in the competition in which it did so during the season in that the resignation be carried out. 3 - If the resignation is made outside the aforementioned period, the resigning team, in order to compete, must do so in the last of the categories organized by the Federation. 4 - The resignation made by teams that have participated in the final or elimination phases of promotion will be considered, in any case, made after the deadline, and will mean not being able to participate in the following season, in any final or elimination phase of promotion.

5 - The resignation after the term will also entail the payment of the amount of the expenses that said decision may entail to the federal administration.

ARTICLE 110°.- In the event that a Club renounces its category or the right to promotion, the vacancy that occurs in the Competition will be filled following the corresponding classification order in the lower category, with the exceptions that may be established in the corresponding competition bases. .

ARTICLE 111°.- Those teams that due to withdrawals in the superior competition, were able to ascend to it, without having qualified for it, may resign at any time to the promotion, without loss of the category they had, and as long as they have not expressly confirmed their desire to fill the vacancy produced in the top competition.

ARTICLE 112°.- If in a match the Referee is forced to interrupt it due to the seriously incorrect attitude of the public, the Competition Committee, freely appreciating all the circumstances that may arise in the case, the seriousness of the disturbances, and the public causing they will agree on the resumption of the meeting, also deciding the conditions and manner in which they are to be held, as well as any compensation that may be applicable.

ARTICLE 113°.- If a match was to be interrupted due to the attitude of the components of the two contending teams, the Competition and Discipline Committee may validate the result reflected by the marker at the time of the interruption.

ARTICLE 114°.- If, in a match, the Referee is forced to suspend the match due to the lack of availability of the field of play for the local Club, or because it does not have the necessary technical conditions or elements, the Competition and Discipline Committee, taking into account the concurrent circumstances. , will determine if it is appropriate to resume the meeting, as well as the conditions and manner in which it is to be carried out and, where appropriate, the compensation that may arise.

ARTICLE 115°.- In the event of the meeting being held again, all the arbitration expenses that are incurred will be borne by the local Club, which must also compensate the visitor, with the amounts indicated by the corresponding federal bodies.

ARTICLE 116°.- When a match is suspended due to the non-appearance of one of the contending teams, the deceased may be deducted 2 points from the general classification, regardless of the loss of the match, and without prejudice to any disciplinary sanctions that may arise. If the non-appearance had been adequately justified at the discretion of the Competition and Discipline Committee, justifying the cause or reason for the non-presentation, the federal bodies will order the new meeting, being in charge of the Club causing the suspension the new travel expenses that the team initially presented had to carry out, as well as the arbitration costs and any others that the celebration of the new meeting could produce.

ARTICLE 117°.- The players or teams that at the request of the Judge-Referee to start the competition delay it, and provided that it did not obey just cause in the opinion of the Competition and Discipline Committee, it will be considered as non-appearance.

ARTICLE 118°.- In case of non-appearance of the Judge-Referee designated for a match, he may be replaced by another Judge-Referee of the same category and modality of the incompetent, present at the bowling alley, or by any other non-collegiate person, upon agreement between both teams, this circumstance being recorded in the Minutes with the agreement of the captains.

ARTICLE 119°.- When it appears from the arbitration report in the opinion of the Competition and Discipline Committee, that the arbitration could not be carried out freely due to the coercive attitude of the public, or due to any other circumstances that caused fear of violence in the participants, the Competition and Discipline Committee will determine if the meeting is to be repeated in whole or in part, on ground other than the one held, or behind closed doors.

If guilt in players or teams arises from the investigations carried out, and as a consequence thereof, such a situation has occurred, regardless of the corresponding disciplinary sanctions, the expenses produced by the new celebration will be borne by the guilty parties.

ARTICLE 120°.- In the event that the Minutes of a meeting do not reflect, in the opinion of the Competition Committee, the actual result thereof, it may cancel the meeting and determine its celebration in a timely manner and place, the expenses being borne by the organizing Federation of the competition.

ARTICLE 121°.- The Minutes of a meeting raised by the Judge-Referee will be sent to:

- FEB
- The corresponding Federation
- The Judges-Referees Committee
- The contending teams, if the competition is by League or Cup system
- The organizing body of the competition

ARTICLE 122°.- The Judge-Referee may exceptionally substitute the obligation to reflect the incidents of the match in the Minutes with a report, which must be sent within 24 hours after the end of the match, by urgent mail or by any other system that guarantees reception at term,

when the incidents are of such severity that the physical integrity of any of the teams or of the Judge-Referee himself is jeopardized, stating in the Minutes the mention "FOLLOW REPORT".

ARTICLE 123°.- Any modification of date, time or playing field not expressly authorized by the FEB will not be valid. However, and as an exceptional cause, the Judge-Referee of the match may vary the time, not the day, or the field of play, in case of force majeure or unforeseeable emergency, in compliance with the obligation imposed to exhaust all means to that the meetings take place.

ARTICLE 124°.- Those listed as such will appear in the FEB DISCIPLINARY REGULATION will be considered as specific incidents, their content being applicable when they occur.

SECTION EIGHT - AUDIOVISUAL RIGHTS

ARTICLE 125°.- The organizers of the competitions will allow access to the bowling alleys of the qualified and necessary personnel for television broadcasts of the audiovisual company previously authorized by the FEB.

The organizers will not allow the broadcast of information live on other television during the time of the competitions, except with the express authorization of the FEB. Also, the organizers are obliged to give the FEB a free space in a preferential situation in each bowling alley. for the placement of static advertising.

SIXTH TITLE OF THE SPANISH

CHAMPIONSHIPS

FIRST SECTION - GENERAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE 126°.- State-level competition shall be understood to be one that affects more than one Autonomous Community, that is, when athletes or sports clubs from various Autonomous Communities participate in it.

In each of the modalities they will take a characteristic name. In general, they will be known generically under the following nomenclature: "SPANISH CHAMPIONSHIP (CATEGORY AND MODALITY)".

ARTICLE 127°.- In order for a Spanish Championship to achieve the quality of such, it must be approved by the FEB General Assembly prior proposal to its Board of Directors. The creation, petition and approval of Spanish Championships, in those modalities that are acquiring the national scope, will require the existence of federative licenses issued by the FEB and by

Therefore, the practice of the modality in question, in 2 Sports Federations at regional level and 4 Provinces.

SECOND SECTION - OF ITS CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 128°.- All the players, Clubs and Federations attached to the FEB will be able to compete in the aforementioned Spanish Championships organized by the FEB, provided that they were not involved in a disciplinary or administrative process, as well as up-to-date with their obligations and fulfilled the requirements of the FEB in the specific bases of the competition in question.

ARTICLE 129°.- The Championships, names, development, characteristics and peculiarity of each specialty, will be considered in the Regulations of each one of them, if necessary, and will be understood in any case, as independent and exclusive for each specialty.

THIRD SECTION - PARTICIPATION

ARTICLE 130°.- For the participation in the different Spanish Championships of the specialties attached to the FEB, the provisions of the specific regulations of each specialty will be followed, and in any case, the provisions of the FEB Board of Directors, being an essential requirement that the Players have the current national federative license issued by the FEB.

ARTICLE 131°.- It will be an essential requirement for participation in the Spanish Championships that the players have taken part in the corresponding Territories, unless specific regulations provide otherwise.

ARTICLE 132°.- In those Open or freely registered Spanish Championships, all those players who register in due time and form, and who meet the requirements stipulated in the Bases of the competition in question, may participate.

The players participating in the preliminary qualifying phase will make their runs on the number of dates to be established based on the number of registered, and distinguishing, in terms of the days of participation, between players from the same and from different Territories.

The number of days to be established will be conditioned on the basis of working days of the game and effective hours, and depending on the number of possible players per day.

ARTICLE 133°.- Players who by right have to participate in the final phase of the Spanish Championship, unless the specific regulations indicate otherwise, are exempt from fulfilling the registration obligation for their participation, a circumstance that does not exempt them in any case from participate in said final phase.

ARTICLE 134°.- The Territorial Champion, provided that the Championship is homologated by the FEB, will acquire the right as such of representation in the Final Phase of the Spanish Championship, provided that in the modality in question, and within the corresponding category, they participate 8 players and 16 players have a registered license, unless specific regulations indicate otherwise.

ARTICLE 135°.- The results of the qualifying Territorial Championships for the corresponding Spain Championship will be sent to the FEB at least (20) days prior to the celebration thereof, this being an essential requirement to be able to exercise the right of participation.

FOURTH SECTION - CALENDARS

ARTICLE 136°.- The places, days and times of completion will be included in the FEB National Calendar as a general and specific title for each case.

ARTICLE 137°.- The FEB will issue (15) days before the celebration of the same, the participation circular, and schedules of the corresponding competition.

SECTION FIVE - REFEREES AND COMMITTEES

ARTICLE 138°.- The FEB will ratify, at the proposal of the National Committee of Judges-Referees, the collegiates for each of the Championships included in the National Calendar.

ARTICLE 139°.- Any Judge-Referee designated for a competition may not participate in it as a player, even in the event that said competition is held on several dates, and on one of them was not designated to arbitrate.

ARTICLE 140°.- In all the official National Competitions there will be a Delegate of the FEB

ARTICLE 141°.- The Competition Committee of the Spanish Championships will be formed, without prejudice to any incompatibilities that may arise, by:

- Technical Director or Delegate of the FEB
- President of the Club or entity delegated to carry out the organization
- Tournament Referee or Judge

SECTION SIX - FINANCING

ARTICLE 142°.- The FEB will contribute as a subsidy for the organization of the different Spanish Championships, the amounts approved by the General Assembly in the Annual Ordinary Budget.

OF UNIFORMITY

FIRST SECTION - GENERAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE 143°.- The uniform for the practice of Bowling Sport constitutes the external sign that identifies the person who wears it, the condition of player, and that represents, depending on the case, the player himself, Club, Peña or Association, Territorial Federation or FEB

ARTICLE 144°.- Uniformity as a whole, which includes the emblem of the Club or Federation represented, will be an essential requirement to participate in any official competition, assuming its failure to disqualify it.

SECOND SECTION - OF THE COMPOSITION AND TYPES OF UNIFORMITY

ARTICLE 145°.- The traditional uniform will consist of the following components: 1 - SHIRT: It will be of the polo type, short sleeves and white. 2 - PANTS / SKIRTS: Traditional navy blue. 3 - SHOES: White.

4 - JERSEY: In those cases where it is used, it is navy blue. 5 - SHIELD: The one of the Club or Federation represented.

This uniform will be mandatory, unless the player, Club or Federation had registered with the FEB your own.

ARTICLE 146°.- Depending on the representation that the player holds in each competition, the following types of uniform will be understood: 1 - **INDIVIDUAL PLAYER** : Carried by the player participating in individual competitions representing himself as a natural person.

Said uniform, regarding the color of its components, will be determined by the player himself, being able to print on the back of the shirt, the name of the owner as well as the advertising that is determined by regulation, and within the limits indicated in these Regulations. 2 - **CLUB** : Carried by the player assigned to a Club, representing it in the competitions in which it participates. Said uniform, with regard to the color of its components, will be determined by the Club itself, and must bear the shield or anagram of it on the upper left front of the shirt.

Exceptionally, the player will be authorized, in those individual participation competitions, to wear the uniform of the Club to which he belongs.

3 - TERRITORIAL : Carried by the player assigned to an FDAА, representing it in the competitions in which it participates. Said uniform, with regard to the coloring of its components, will be determined by the FDAА itself, and the shield or anagram of it must be worn on the upper left front of the shirt. On the back, the name of the FDAА and the advertising that may be determined by regulation may be inserted, and within the limits established in these Regulations. **4 - NATIONAL** : Carried by the player assigned to the FEB, representing it in the competitions in which it participates. Said uniform, in terms of color of its components, will be determined by the FEB itself, and must bear the FEB crest on the upper front of the shirt. On the back, the holder's name and "SPAIN" may be inserted. , as well as the publicity that the FEB determines by regulation, in the event that the competition is held within the territory of the Spanish State, or that determined by the International Federation, if the competition is held outside its borders.

ARTICLE 147°.- The composition of the individual player, club and territorial uniforms will be communicated to the FEB one month before the start of the competition, who will proceed to register and authorize it, if appropriate, in writing.

THIRD SECTION - OF COMMON SITUATIONS

ARTICLE 148°.- The collision of color in the uniformity of individual player, Club and FDAА will be avoided, in order to better identify the representation that the player holds in each case.

ARTICLE 149°.- The uniformity registered for the first time will be valid until a new communication by the player, Club or FDAА of the appropriate modification. From the authorization issued by the FEB, the first registered uniformity will be annulled, and the new one will be in force.

ARTICLE 150°.- The uniforms referred to in the previous article may carry the advertising chosen by each of the holders, in accordance with the provisions of this Regulation, which will be communicated to the FEB one month before the start of the competition for approval.

ARTICLE 151°.- Every player is obliged to take care of his appearance and composure, adhering to the provisions that regulate uniformity.

OF ADVERTISING

FIRST SECTION - GENERAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE 152°.- An advertising activity by the FEB is considered, for the appropriate purposes, any disclosure to direct the attention of the public or the media, towards a certain person, product or service, in order to immediately propose their hiring. Said advertising activity shall comply with the provisions of the regulations in force on the matter.

SECOND SECTION - OF THE RULES AND THEIR APPLICATION

ARTICLE 153°.- Anything of a regulatory nature established in relation to advertising, will be applicable in all those sports competitions and acts of national scope and smaller federal federative structures depending on the FEB, these being by way of example and not limiting:

- Sports competitions.
- Acts as a consequence of competitions.
- Protocols.

ARTICLE 154°.- The regulations referred to in the previous article will apply to natural and legal persons dependent on the FEB and participants in the competitions, that is:

- Tournament Sponsor
- Tournament Organizer
- Participating Players, Clubs, Referees and Federations

ARTICLE 155°.- The advertising to be exhibited in each of the types of uniformity will be communicated with all kinds of details to the FEB, one month before the start of the competition, which, in view of it, will proceed to its registration and approval, if applicable, in writing.

ARTICLE 156.- Two types of collisions will be understood in advertising:

- Of legal order
- Of brands

OF LEGAL ORDER : Collisions of a legal nature will be resolved in accordance with the purpose established by the Law, so that advertising firms prohibited in current legislation, as well as those not admitted by the FEB Assembly will be subject to such prohibition.

OF BRANDS : The collision of brands will be resolved in favor of the organizer, so the participant in the competition must transfer their rights for the benefit of the organizer.

ARTICLE 157°.- The FEB reserves all the rights and actions that correspond to those publications or broadcasts that threaten its image, usurp its rights for its own benefit, or mislead third parties.

THIRD SECTION - CLASSES AND THEIR DEFINITION

ARTICLE 158°.- The FEB, by virtue of its own competence, determines the following types of advertising:

- STATIC
- MOBILE
- ACOUSTICS

STATIC

Static advertising is all that located on the periphery and within the gaming venue (Bowling Alley), in which case it will not affect the execution of the game.

The rights of the same will correspond to the organization or Club in which it delegates. The following elements are considered **within static advertising**: 1 - **Fences** : The billboards, as the organizer's right, may be placed throughout the Bowling alley where they do not impede the normal development of the game, and will be of measures limited to the maximum allowable, according to the characteristics of the Bowling alley, so that the vision of the Spectators are perfect from all angles.

The billboards that the Clubs have in their facilities, subject their right to the advertising contracted for the purpose for the **competition by the organization, or by the Club, if so delegated**. 2 - **ADVERTISING POSTERS** : All those posters announcing the National Championships will carry, in addition to dates, installation and organizers, the FEB emblem, the text FEDERACION ESPAÑOLA DE BOLOS, the organizing Club emblem, and the logo corresponding to the competition.

MOBILE

It is the one that the player carries.

The rights of the same will correspond to the player, Club, Territorial Federation or FEB, depending on the representation that the player holds at any time. The player must carry in the DORSAL the advertising contracted by the organizer of the competition, or its delegated entity. In attention to the types of uniformity to be exhibited by the player, the advertising will be placed in the form and terms detailed below:

LOWER HALF

INDIVIDUAL PLAYER UNIFORM : Advertising whose text will not exceed 30x6 cm. (High by wide).

NATIONAL UNIFORM : Advertising, the text of which will not exceed 30x6 cm. (width by height), adjusting to what the FEB determines at any time, if the competition is held within the territory of the Spanish State, or the International Federation, if it is held outside its borders.

BOCAMANGA

The sleeve of the shirt, both in the individual player uniform and the Territorial or National Federation, may bear the anagram and / or logo of the advertising that each of them exhibits, whose dimensions will not exceed 10x10 cm. (High by wide). In the Club uniform, it will be free choice. In cases where a jersey or tracksuit jacket is used, advertising on them will be equally arranged as on the shirt.

Bibs

Notwithstanding the places outlined for the exhibition by the advertising player in each of the types of uniformity, the organization, if it has contracted advertising, may demand its exhibition on the participants' bibs, whose measurements do not exceed in its dimension of 16x22 cm. (width by height), and formed by the following components: UPPER PART: Title of the competition - measures 4x16 cm. (width by height) CENTRAL PART: Number of the corresponding number - measures 10x16 cm. (width by height) BOTTOM: Name of the advertising firm - measures 8x16 cm. (width by height) The collision of advertising in the uniform of individual player, Club and Territorial will be avoided, in order to better identify the representation that the player holds in each case.

ACOUSTICS

It is manifested through sound devices, provided that it can manifest outside the competition period (rest).

The rights of the same will correspond exclusively to the organization or Club in which it delegates.

**TITLE NINE OF THE
PROTOCOLS**

FIRST SECTION - GENERAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE 159°.- Protocol is the final act of any competition or meeting, in which deference is paid to the federal and sports structure.

SECOND SECTION - OF THE RULES AND THEIR APPLICATION

ARTICLE 160°.- The regulations on Protocol will be applicable in all those competitions of national scope, and federative structures of minor order depending on the FEB

ARTICLE 161°.- The development of what is determined by regulation in relation to the Protocols, will affect the natural and legal persons dependent on the FEB, and participants in the competitions, that is:

THIRD SECTION - CLASSES AND THEIR IMPLEMENTATION

ARTICLE 162º.- Three types of protocol acts will be understood, namely:

- SPORTS
- INSTITUTIONAL
- SPECIAL

SPORTS

They are those in which players intervene and are born as a consequence of the competition itself, by determining a classification with positional situations (1st-2nd-3rd, etc.)

In the player protocols, where the federal and political authorities will also intervene as institutional representatives, the following must be observed, in any case:

- 1 - At the awards ceremony, the player will always be on a higher plane (podium), with the exception of Bolo Palma National Circuit Tournaments.
- 2 - The political or federative authority will address the player at the awards ceremony.
- 3 - In no case will the protocol undermine the importance and preponderance of the player. Prior to the dispute of the final phase by the players classified in the last four places, a prior protocol will be carried out, in which the awards will be made to the players classified in the previous positions.

Only the players classified in the first four places will take part in the final protocol, acting as follows:

PLAYERS NOMINATION

The public address services will nominate the winner, who will rise to the podium (except CINA Bolo Palma Tournaments), granting him the time frame indicated by the public ovation, acting in the same way with the following classifieds.

TROPHY DISTRIBUTION

Once the players are placed on the podium, the trophies will be awarded, in accordance with the following actions:

A - Delivery to the champion of the COPA DE SM EL REY Y LA REINA, if the tournament has been awarded, or failing that, that of the sponsor (COPA FEB, COPA F. TERRITORIAL).

B - Delivery to the champion of the significant gold medal and Diploma. C - Delivery to the runner-up of significant silver medal and Diploma. H - Award trophy to the fourth place.

NATIONAL ANTHEM

Once the Trophies are distributed and held by those interested, the public address services will proceed to interpret the National Anthem of Spain, with the exception of the CINA Bolo Palma Tournaments

CLOSURE

Once the National Anthem has been interpreted, the President of the FEB or person in whom he delegates, will declare the competition closed.

The players involved in the protocol have the obligation to attend, free of charge, all the complementary events to the Championship itself.

INSTITUTIONAL

They obey at the call of the Federation itself, either Spanish or territorial federative structures, as a consequence of Competitions or Assemblies. The institutional protocols will act as follows:

OPENING

It will be carried out by the highest-ranking person or organization, sponsor of the event or delegate. The following interventions will be made in reverse order to the hierarchy.

CLOSING OF THE ACT

It will always be done by the President of the FEB, or person in whom he delegates.

SECTION FIVE - TROPHY DISTRIBUTION

ARTICLE 167°.- The Trophy for the Champion of Spain will always be that of the FEB, only and exclusively substituted in the case of that Championship that has been awarded the SM El Rey Cup. In all cases, said winner's Trophy will be exempt from advertising and the text on it will be:

**"SPANISH BOWLING FEDERATION"
SPANISH CHAMPION CATEGORY
AND MODALITY
PLACE AND DATE ACRONYM
ORGANIZATION**

Likewise, the Champion of Spain will be distinguished with the following Trophies:

- SIGNIFICANT GOLD MEDAL
- DIPLOMA

ARTICLE 168°.- The Trophies assigned to the players classified in the following positions, and intervening in the final protocol, will be in all cases, coming from legally constituted public or private institutions and will be distributed as follows:

- 2nd CLASSIFIED: Significant Silver Medal - Institutional Diploma and Trophies.
- 3rd. CLASSIFIED: Significant Bronze Medal - Diploma and Institutional Trophy.
- 4th CLASSIFIED: Institutional Diploma and Trophy.

SECTION SIX - OF THE INCIDENTS

ARTICLE 169°.- The Trophies in no case should, within the protocol, perch on the ground or substitute one trophy for another, in order to give the space that corresponds to each one.

ARTICLE 170°.- The trophies that the FEB must provide for a Championship must be required one month in advance of the FEB by the delegated Club of the organization.

ARTICLE 171°.- The Trophies will be exposed to the public prior to the Championship, in order to make it more widely available.

OF THE INTERNATIONAL REPRESENTATION

ARTICLE 172º .- The FEB will hold the representation of Spain in official international sports activities and competitions held outside and within Spanish territory. For these purposes, the FEB will be in charge of choosing the athletes to be part of the national teams, and in any case, they will be made up of players with Spanish nationality.

ARTICLE 173º.- To organize, request or compromise the activities or competitions indicated in the previous article, the FEB must obtain authorization from the Higher Sports Council, being, regarding the regime of the same, to the organization of international activities and representations.

ADDITIONAL PROVISION.- As soon as their incorporation into the structures of the autonomous federative organizations and the Spanish Federation takes place, the Sports Associations must adapt their statutory norms to their prescriptions and these Regulations.

FIRST FINAL PROVISION.- The present General Regulations of the FEB consisting of 173 articles, an additional provision and three final provisions, distributed on sheets numbered from 1 to 42, will enter into force from the date of their approval by the Board of Directors of the SUPERIOR COUNCIL SPORTS.

SECOND FINAL PROVISION.- Any provisions of the same or lower rank that oppose the provisions of these Regulations are hereby repealed.

THIRD FINAL PROVISION.- Given the difference between the gaming systems of the different specialties attached to the FEB, in case of doubt in the application of certain articles of these General Regulations, the provisions of the specific regulations of each of them will be followed.
